



# “Pinocchio Wished Upon A Star” Quilt

Quilt approximate size 48" square

All border strip length measurements are approximate. Please measure your quilt top before cutting the length of each border.

## Fabric Requirements

Fabric A: Pinocchio Panel	1 panel of TK-9011-9C-1
Fabric B: Green Words	3/8 yard of TK-9602-9C-2
Fabric C: Brown Words	1/3 yard of TK-9602-9C-1
Fabric D: Red Gate Scroll	7/8 yard of TK-9012-9C-6
Fabric E: Coral Gate Scroll	1/3 yard of TK-9012-9C-2
Fabric F: Yellow Gate Scroll	3/8 yard of TK-9012-9C-5
Fabric G: Green Leaves	1/4 yard of TK-9606-9C-1
Fabric H: Dk. Green Leaves	1/4 yard of TK-9606-9C-2
Fabric I: Characters & Words	7/8 yard of TK-9601-9C-1
Fabric J: Tan Gate Scrolls	1/2 yard of TK-9012-9C-9
Fabric K: Blue Fairies	1/4 yard of TK-9013-9C-1
Fabric L: Lt. Blue Stars	1/4 yard of TK-9598-9C-1
Fabric M: Blue Stars	1/3 yard of TK-9598-9C-2
Fabric N: Navy Stars	7/8 yard of TK-9598-9C-3
Backing	3-1/4 yards of your choice

- Fussy cut one large panel 12-1/2" x 17-1/2"
- Fussy cut four small panels 8-1/2" x 10-1/2"
- Cut fifty-two 2-1/2" squares.
- Cut thirty-six 2-1/2" squares
- Cut two 2" x 18-1/2" and two 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" strips
- Cut thirteen 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips
- Cut five 2-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips.
- Cut thirteen 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut two 1" x 13-1/2" and two 1" x 17-1/2" strips
- Cut six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make two 1-1/2" x 46-1/2" and two 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips for the outer border.
- Cut nine 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut nine 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut two 6" x 28-1/2" strips for sides from the Length of Fabric (LOF). Cut two 4" x 24-1/2" from the WOF for the top and bottom.
- Cut eighty-eight 2-1/2" squares.
- Cut four 4-1/2" squares.
- Cut nine 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut thirteen 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut twenty-two 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips.
- Cut two 1" x 28-1/2" strips, eight 1" x 10-1/2" strips and six 1" x 24-1/2" strips for sashing. Cut six 1" x WOF strips. Piece the together for 1" x 46-1/2" strips.
- Cut two 56" x WOF strips. Piece into one 56" square

## Assembly Instructions:

- 1) Sew one 1" x 17-1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the large panel. Sew one 1" x 13-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the panel. Sew one 2" x 18-1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of the large panel. Sew one 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" Fabric D to the top and bottom of the large panel to make the center panel.

NOTE: For the following flying geese blocks made in Steps 2-3, refer to the quilt photo or decide how you would like the directional prints to run in the quilt. Make sure when you lay each directional print square onto the rectangle you flip back the square across the diagonal before sewing to double check the final direction of each corner.

- 2) Place one 2-1/2" Fabric C square on the left side of one 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3) Place another 2-1/2" Fabric C square on the right side of the 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make one flying goose.
- 4) Repeat Steps 2-3 to make the nine of each combo; H/C flying geese, L/C flying geese, G/J flying geese and N/J flying geese. Refer to Figure 5 and sew the H/C flying geese to the top of the L/C flying geese to make nine H/C/L blocks. Refer to Figure 5 and sew the G/J flying geese to the top of the N/J flying geese to make nine G/J/N blocks.
- 5) Repeat Steps 2-3 to make the thirteen of each combo; N/B flying geese, D/B flying geese, M/J flying geese and E/J flying geese. Refer to Figure 5 and sew the N/B flying geese to the top of the D/B flying geese to make thirteen N/B/D blocks. Refer to Figure 5 and sew the M/J flying geese to the top of the E/J flying geese to make thirteen M/J/E blocks.
- 6) Refer to the quilt photo for block placements to sew the nine H/C/L blocks and nine G/J/N blocks together into two row of five blocks for the first side pieced borders and two rows of four blocks for the first top and bottom pieced borders. Sew the two side pieced borders to the center panel. Sew one 4-1/2" Fabric K square to each end of the top and bottom pieced borders. Sew the top and bottom borders to the center panel.
- 7) Sew one 1" x 24-1/2" Fabric N strips to the top and bottom of the center panel. Sew one 4" x 24-1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the center panel. Sew another 1" x 24-1/2" Fabric N strip to the top and bottom of the center panel.
- 8) Refer to the quilt photo for block placement to sew the thirteen M/J/E blocks and thirteen N/B/D blocks together into two six block borders for the second top and bottom pieced borders and two seven block borders for the second pieced side borders.
- 9) Sew the top and bottom pieced borders to the center panel. Sew the remaining two 1" x 24-1/2" Fabric N strip to the top and bottom of the center panel to complete the center section.
- 10) Sew one 1" x 10-1/2" Fabric N strip to the top and bottom of each 8-1/2" x 10-1/2" Fabric panel to make the four corner blocks.
- 11) To make the left border, sew one 1" x 28-1/2" Fabric N strip to the right side of one side pieced border. Sew one 6" x 28-1/2" Fabric I strip to the right side of the Fabric N strip. Refer to the quilt photo and sew one corner block to the top and bottom of the left pieced border. To make the right border, sew one 1" x 28-1/2" Fabric N strip to the left side of the other side pieced border. Sew one 6" x 28-1/2" Fabric I strip to the left side of the Fabric N strip. Refer to the quilt photo and sew one corner block to the top and bottom of the right pieced border. Sew the borders to the center to make the quilt top.
- 12) Sew one 1" x 46-1/2" Fabric N strip to each side of the quilt top.
- 13) Sew one 1-1/2" x 46-1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 14) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.

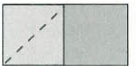

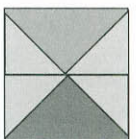
